Dear Supporters and Friends,

It's our honour and privilege to work together with you, saving street animals' lives with medical care, comfort and love.

Every year marks not only the rehabilitation of thousands of animals, but incremental and *lasting* change in the community. We measure our impact with the ever-increasing number of calls we receive on our helpline and by people's increasingly swift detection of animals in need. Their heightened vigilance and deep interest in keeping up with the progress of the animals their call helped save is yet another sign of Animal Aid's transformative effect.

Our outreach and education teams involve helpline callers in the recovery of the animals by providing regular medical updates, and giving thorough guidance about how to care for the animal once recovered and returned, to prevent future illness or injury. Our efforts result in animal lovers having an increased understanding of medical issues, when and how to help, and an even deeper bond with the animals around them.



This year was a milestone in our efforts to make a healthier stray dog community through spay, neuter and vaccination. Many street dog injuries and problems are avoided by spay and neuter. To reduce suffering, we have intensified our focus on *prevention* by re-opening our Sterilisation Center which we'd shut down during the COVID pandemic. To this end we undertook months of planning, vital liaison with the Udaipur Municipal Corporation to formalize Animal Aid's Sterilisation Program; we expanded our surgery rooms, hired additional staff, and more, culminating in a wonderful ceremony and ribbon-cutting event to mark the start of an even better future for Udaipur's community dogs.

We have felt your presence with us through every rescue, every animal rehabilitated, and every sanctuary animal finding peace and comfort in their home with us.


With your incredible generosity and dedication, we are thrilled at the achievements of this year and excited for even more growth in the future.



NEW ROOFS FOR OUR SANCTUARY ANIMALS

SHELTER IMPROVEMENTS

Our herd of sanctuary cows and bulls has continued to grow, and with the greater numbers was a need for **expansion of rain protection during monsoons.**

We replaced all of the old roofs, nearly doubling the amount of area covered as well as raising the roofing allowing for better ventilation as well as protection from the elements.

When the monsoon rains arrived, we were delighted to see just what an improvement it was and the animals thoroughly approved!





Every year during the rainy season we have storms that bring down branches and sometimes entire trees. Our shelter had many trees posing a high risk of falling.

So we flew in 3 expert arborists, who shipped their tree-climbing gear and chainsaws with them and spent an entire week carefully removing the risky trees while maintaining the safety of all our animals.

TOWARDS A HAPPIER, HEALTHIER, STRAY DOG POPULATION

While we have always spayed/neutered and vaccinated each one of our rescues before returning them back to the community, in 2023 we launched our new CNVR (catch, neuter, vaccinate, release) program with the reopening of our renovated sterilization center, which we had to shut down during the COVID pandemic.

At the start of the 2023, Animal Aid signed a **Memorandum of Understanding** with the Udaipur Municipal Corporation giving Animal Aid the sole charge of running a city-wide CNVR program, ensuring humane treatment of the dogs and a scientific approach to managing the stray dog population.

All during 2022, we did **major works** and refurbished our Operating Room and Presurgery room where patients are prepped for surgery, as well as constructing a post-surgery recovery room to accommodate a higher volume of surgeries each day.

With this expansion we can now provide even better post-operative care for the dogs and overall improve the flow and efficiency of the work-space.

With the cutting of one simple red ribbon in March 2023, we celebrated the **re-opening of our Sterilization Center** which will save lives in so many ways, from preventing the suffering and death of puppies, to eliminating rabies, to reducing instances of cruelty to dogs.

Our chief guest was Udaipur Municipal Corporation Commissioner, Shri Vasudev Malawat, and we were joined by many local long-time supporters. We're thrilled to be providing this essential service to the city, as well as cultivating support of the city municipal government.



Although you were not with us in person, we felt your presence in spirit and we honoured the support you have given that made this milestone possible. Animal Aid is now providing this vital service to the city thanks to you, our amazing donors, ensuring that the wonderful community dogs of Udaipur are treated with the utmost care and that animal welfare is always the number one priority.

LEARNING FROM OTHERS

In November 2022 Animal Aid Executive Director Claire Myers and Operations Manager Guja Lucheschi visited **Soi Dog Foundation**, in Thailand, where for two weeks they had inspiring meetings with various heads of departments including their CEO Louise Rose and International Director of Animal Welfare Dr Ala Izydorczyk, gaining knowledge and inspiration from their incredible work.

Soi Dog runs the world's largest sterilization program for dogs and cats, and they have been extremely generous in sharing knowledge, experience, protocols and more. This fruitful visit was made looking towards Animal Aid's future hospital, where we took practical advice as well as inspiration from Soi Dog's excellent facilities, surely one of the very best in all of Asia.

PURCHASING A HILL OF PEACE

With the purchase of an additional piece of land next to the property where our new hospital will be constructed, we've further ensured a peaceful future for Animal Aid's rescued and sanctuary animals. With rapid development happening all around us, we know that in all likelihood by the time we move into our new rescue center & hospital site in the next 4-5 years, the lush fields and hillsides surrounding the property are likely to be replaced by homes, hotels, and likely even wedding or party venues where loud music is regularly played.



A LOOK INTO THE FUTURE



We've experienced first-hand at current hospital how our vulnerable are the surrounding noises, whether fireworks or music blasting from enormous speakers at nearby hotels, and the impact that it has on the animals. This hillside will create а wonderful buffer. ensuring peace and quiet for all the animals in our future hospital and sanctuary.


FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Animal Aid Unlimited is a USA-based, 501c3 tax-exempt charitable organization (est. 2002,) India. Donors from the USA and several other countries can claim tax benefits from their charitable donations to AAU. Funds donated to Animal Aid Unlimited are destined for our hospital and sanctuary in India and Animal Aid Unlimited transfers funds donated outside India to Animal Aid Charitable Trust on a regular basis.

Animal Aid Charitable Trust (est. 2007) provides medical services and sanctuary to animals in Udaipur, Rajasthan India. Indian donors can claim tax benefits from their charitable donations to AACT.


