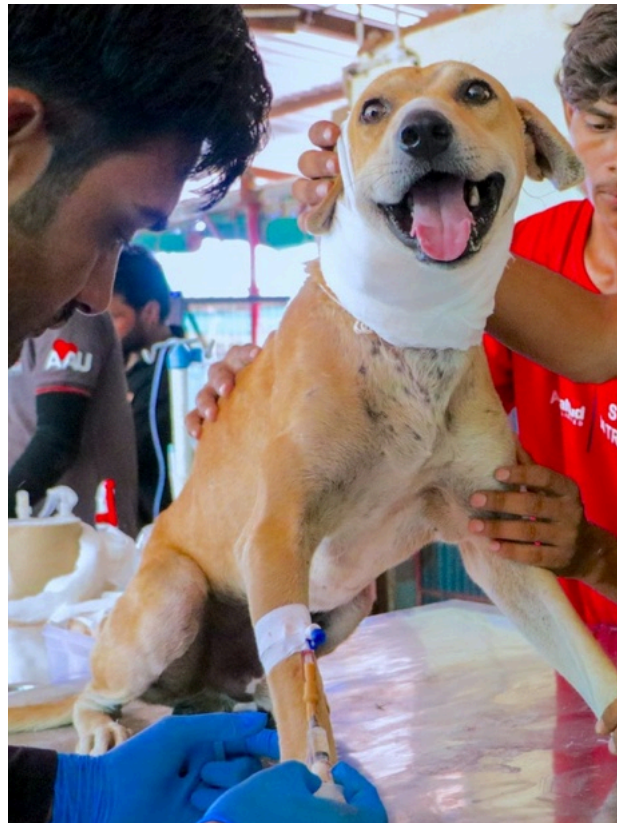
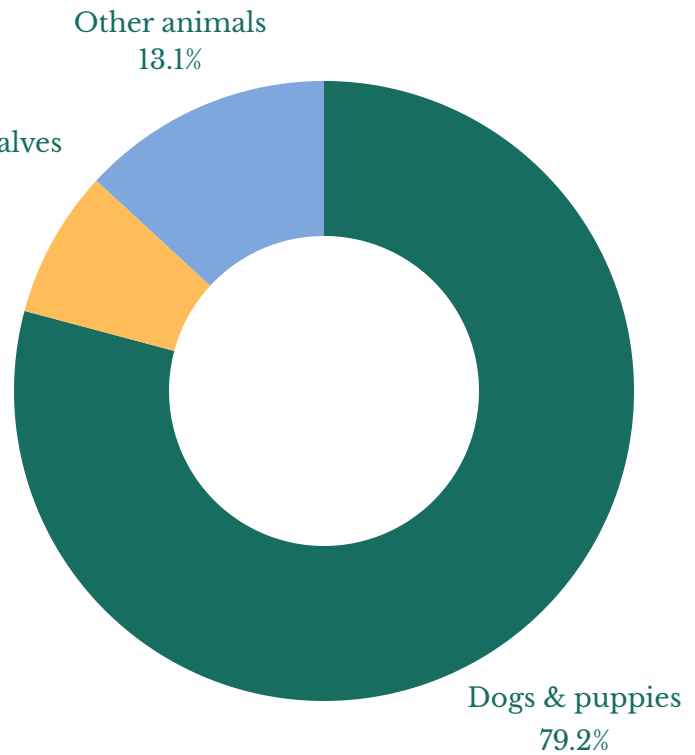
## ANIMALS ADMITTED IN OUR HOSPITAL

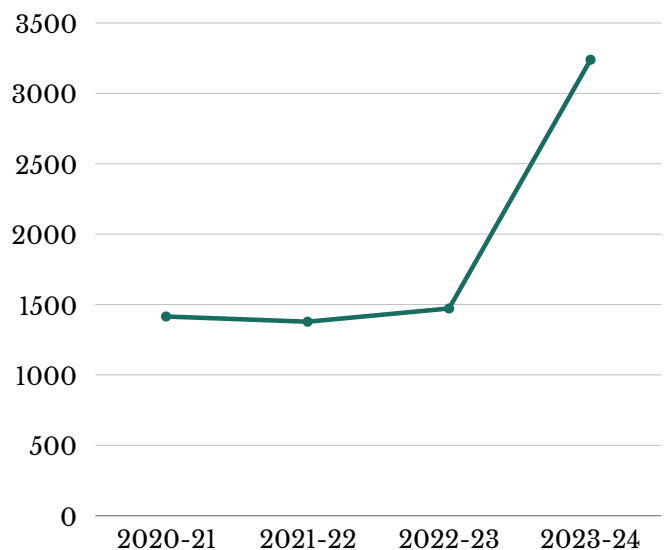
STREET TREATMENT VISITS

ANIMALS STERILIZED

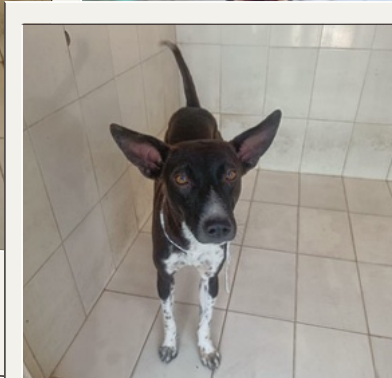
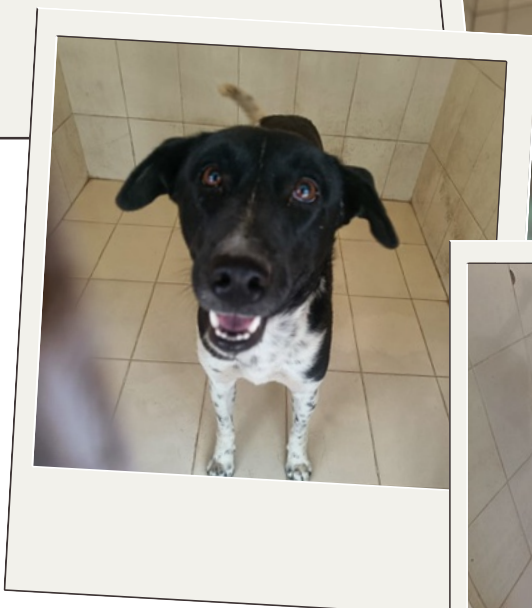
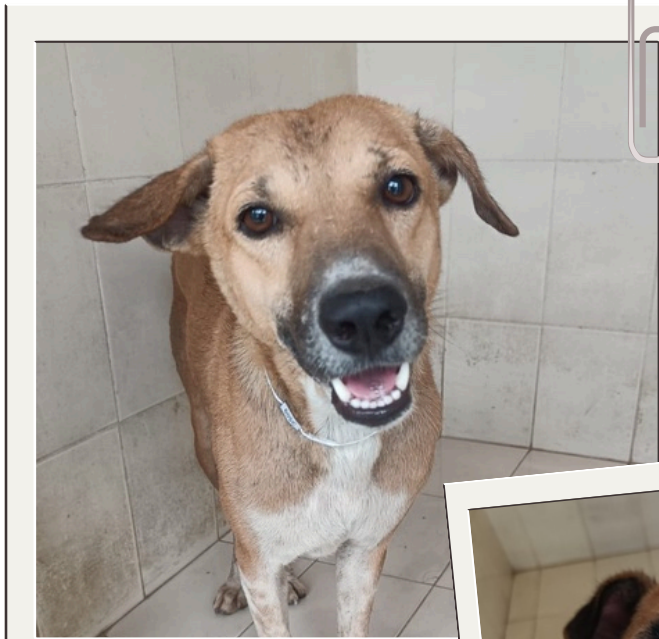
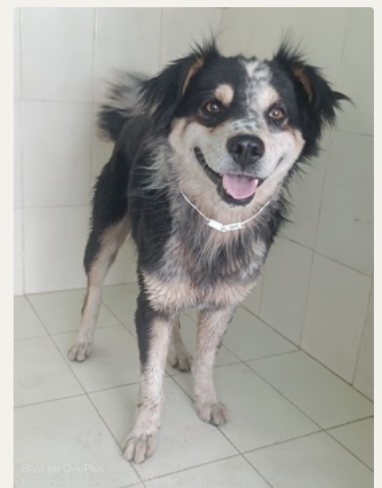
A **120% increase** compared to 2022-23, due to the reopening of our Animal Birth Control center and the launch of our dog sterilization program in January 2023, under an MoU with the local authorities.

*Next to the busy flow of ambulances, hundreds of animals live peacefully in our sanctuary, cared for by our amazing staff*

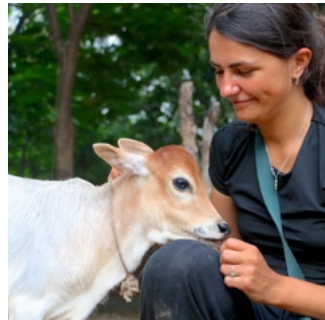

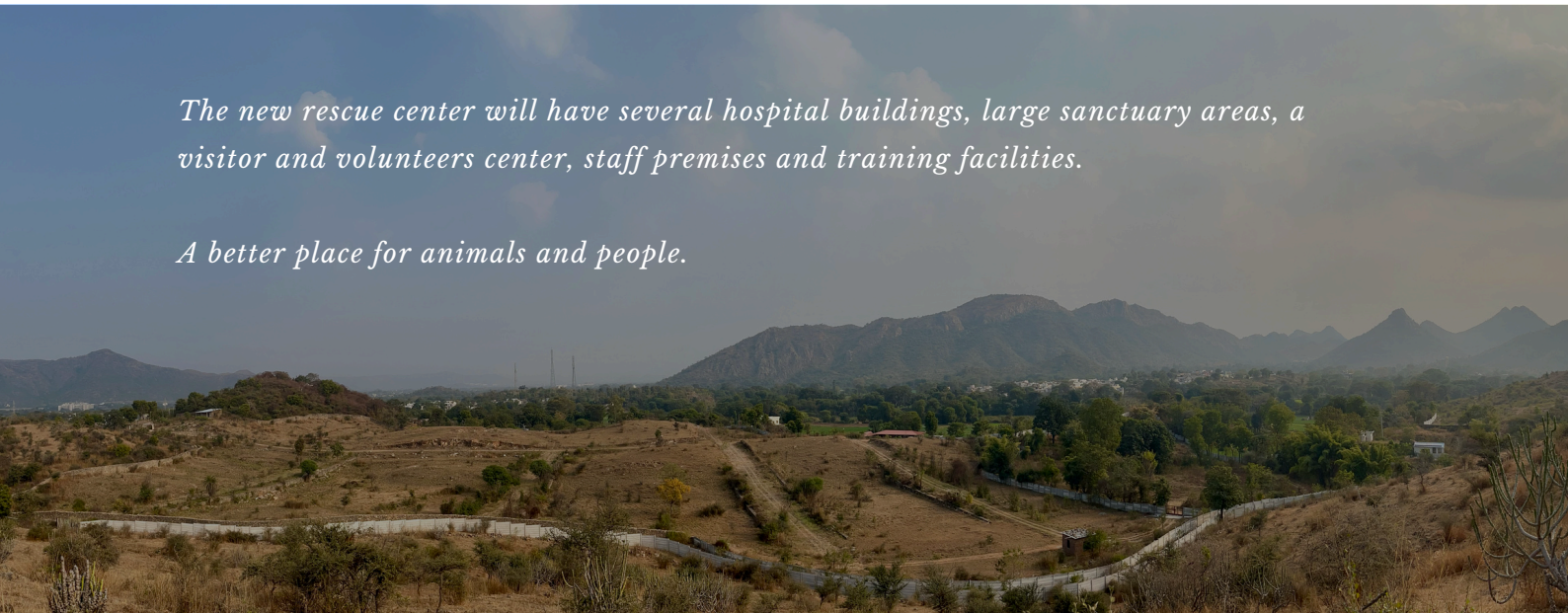
## TWO MORE BIGHAS!

Bighas are a local unit of measure, equaling more or less 2100 sq meters. In October 2023, we finalized the purchase of (almost) two more bighas, which provide us a strategic access to a side road and increased the total area of the new land to 8.3 hectares.

Our current site is about 1 hectare, and we are already looking at additional plots, which would bring the total area to about 10 hectares.

*The new rescue center will have several hospital buildings, large sanctuary areas, a visitor and volunteers center, staff premises and training facilities.*

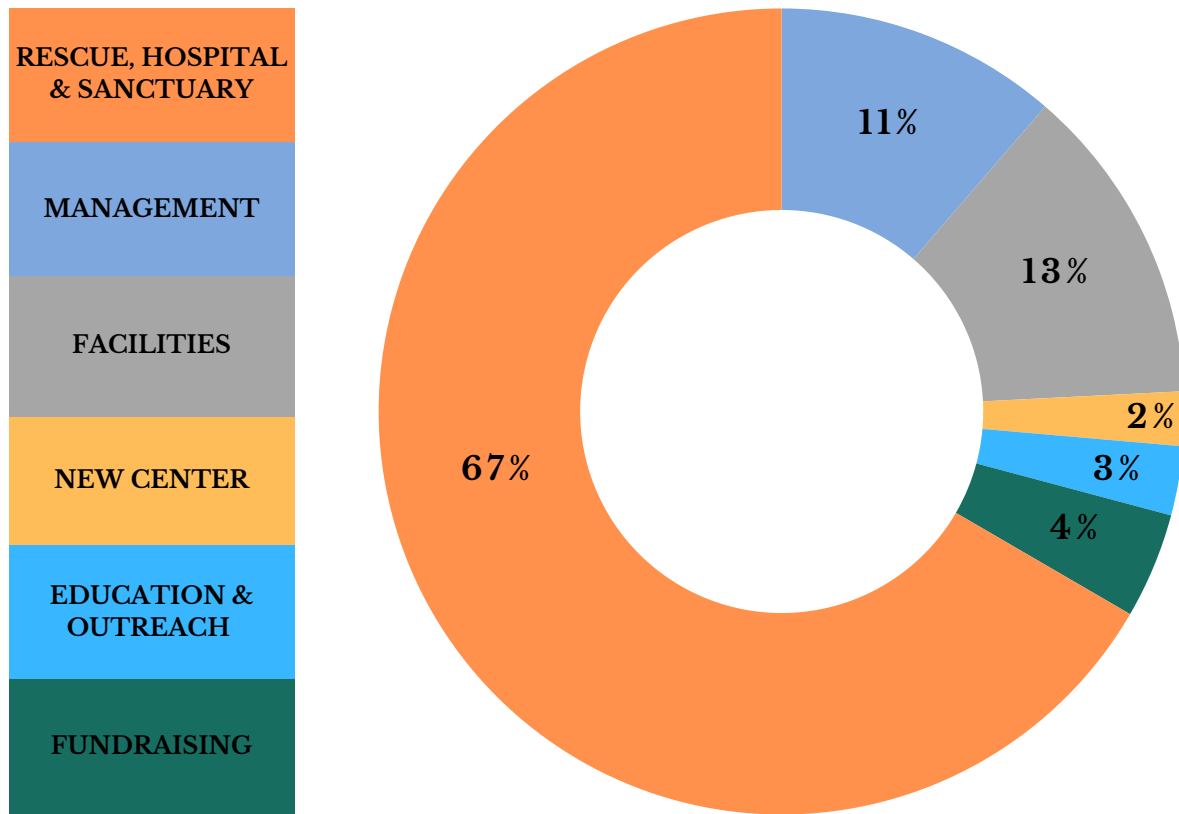

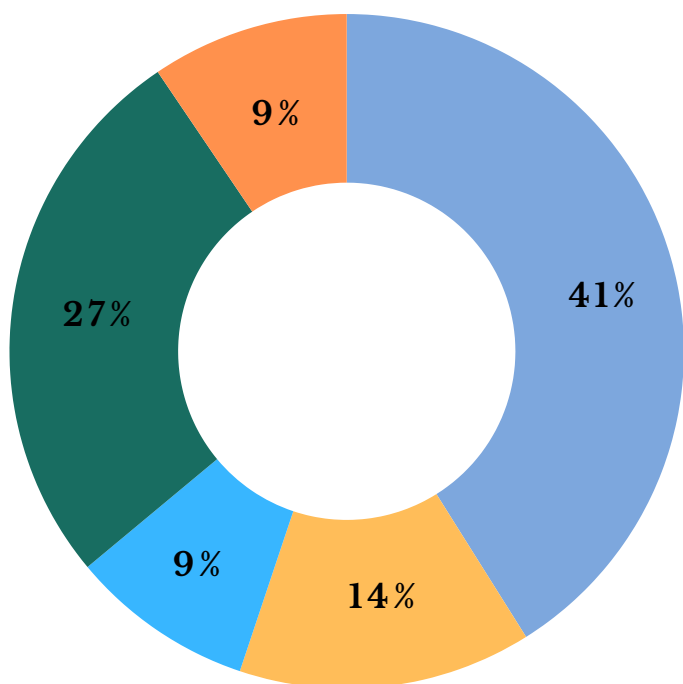

A portion is set aside for emergency needs while the majority will be used for the construction of our new center and the increased operating expenses as our work expands with the new facility.

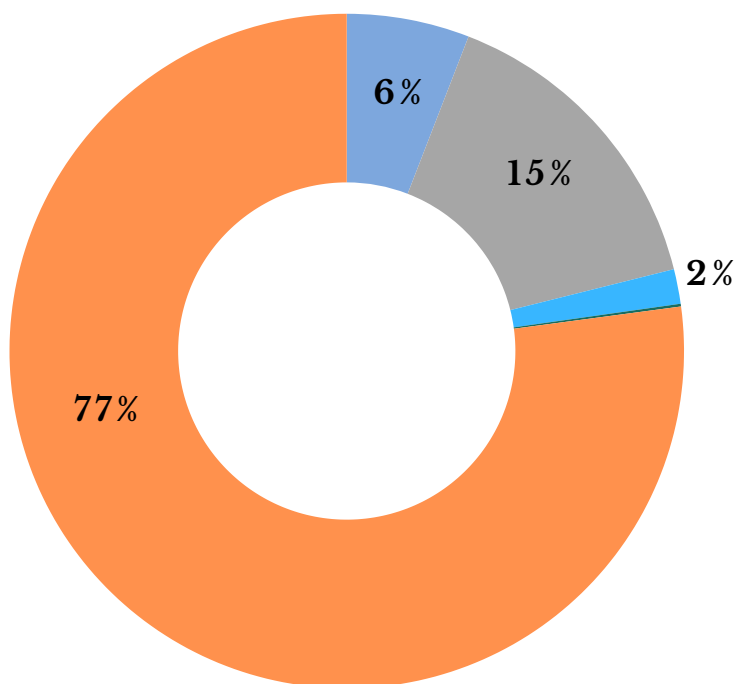
